RE: Submission of U.S. Lawsuit Against CBS Interactive et al. as Evidentiary Material Supporting Claims of Racketeering, Digital Piracy, and Sovereign Interference Relating to the Alpha Nero Affair

Dear Honourable Registrar,

I respectfully submit the enclosed Federal Complaint titled:
Alkiviades David, et al. v. CBS Interactive Inc., CNET Networks Inc.
U.S. District Court, Central District of California
Case No. CV11-09437 (APx), dated November 14, 2011,
as evidentiary material in support of ongoing matters before this Court and related sovereign investigations.

This seminal case—widely covered at the time in The Hollywood Reporter, Variety, Wired, and Billboard—marked one of the first major industry reckonings with institutional digital piracy and corporate responsibility. In the article titled "CBS Interactive Can't Escape Claims of Inducing Piracy," a U.S. federal judge refused to dismiss claims that CBS had materially supported file-sharing and infringement software through its subsidiary CNET and Download.com. This action uncovered a widespread, monetized operation involving the distribution of programs facilitating mass piracy—and, crucially, the trafficking of child exploitation content under the guise of peer-to-peer innovation.

I, Alkiviades David, was one of the lead plaintiffs in this historic action. At the time, I issued a public statement vowing to return with renewed strength to confront the full scope of corporate and judicial corruption that had metastasized between the media, the courts, and the financial elite. That time has come.

The current situation surrounding the Alpha Nero superyacht—where U.S. Treasury influence, CBS-linked law firms, and judicial actors have conspired to forcibly seize, monetize, and politically weaponize private assets on Antiguan soil—is a direct extension of the same pattern of abuse. The individuals and institutions involved now are the very same who orchestrated the campaign against FilmOn, Hologram USA, and SwissX—enterprises which today continue to serve the public good through innovations in green energy, biotech, and sovereign wealth generation.

It is no coincidence that attorneys from David Boies' firm, CBS's legal proxies, are now entangled in the Alpha Nero dispute. Their role in sabotaging lawful business through vexatious litigation, fraudulent filings, and cross-border judicial manipulation has been well documented—and begins with the conduct outlined in this complaint.

This filing represents not just a piece of evidence, but a piece of history—a warning that was ignored. I now reassert my legal and moral position in these proceedings not merely as a businessman, but as a sovereign partner and whistleblower on behalf of Antigua & Barbuda's right to protect its courts and institutions from undue foreign coercion and legal fraud.

I respectfully request that this complaint be entered into the record in any related proceedings and further request that international law experts advising the Court review the RICO predicate elements it contains.
