APPELLANT'S NOTICE OF FURTHER SUPPLEMENTAL MATTERS AND PROCEDURAL DEVELOPMENTS

I. INTRODUCTION

Appellant Alkiviades David, appearing in propria persona, respectfully submits this Notice to inform the Court of the current procedural posture of these consolidated appeals, including:

- 1 Respondent's continued default in filing a Respondent's Brief;
- 2 The existence of parallel proceedings in other jurisdictions involving overlapping parties and subject matter; and
- 3 Limited procedural context relating to Appellant's self-representation and disability, as reflected in the record.

This Notice is submitted solely for informational purposes. It does not seek to augment the appellate record, introduce new evidence, or request any substantive relief.

II. RESPONDENT'S CONTINUED DEFAULT

On March 17, 2026, this Court issued a Notice of Default pursuant to California Rules of Court, rule 8.220(a), due to Respondent's failure to file a Respondent's Brief within the prescribed time.

More than eleven days have now elapsed. No Respondent's Brief has been filed, and no application for relief from default or request for extension of time has been submitted.

Under rule 8.220(a)(2), the Court may decide the appeal on the record and Appellant's Opening Brief alone. The appeal is therefore procedurally positioned for submission and decision on the materials already before the Court.

III. PARALLEL PROCEEDINGS

Appellant is currently a party to proceedings in other jurisdictions involving overlapping parties and related subject matter.

A. Antigua and Barbuda (High Court of Justice, Claim No. ANUHCV2025/0149)

Proceedings were initiated on April 17, 2025, with an Amended Statement of Claim filed on September 24, 2025. These proceedings involve allegations concerning litigation conduct, defamation, and related matters. The High Court has acknowledged the existence of the present California appeals.

B. England and Wales (High Court of Justice, King's Bench Division)

A Third Party Debt Order application in related enforcement proceedings was adjourned by Order dated March 20, 2026, to a date after June 18, 2026.

C. Nature of Overlap

These proceedings involve overlapping parties and related issues concerning litigation conduct, procedural fairness, and enforcement.

This Notice does not invite the Court to determine any issue pending in another jurisdiction. The information is provided solely for contextual awareness.

IV. LIMITED PROCEDURAL CONTEXT FROM PARALLEL PROCEEDINGS

In proceedings before the High Court of Antigua and Barbuda, the Court acknowledged Appellant's filings and the existence of parallel proceedings in California and elsewhere. Appellant clarified that the submitted materials consisted solely of service-related documentation and procedural correspondence, and did not constitute new evidence.

This reference is included solely to reflect the procedural environment in which Appellant is litigating.

V. DISABILITY AND PROCEDURAL CONTEXT

Appellant is a self-represented litigant with a documented disability. Issues relating to disability, requests for accommodation, and disruption of legal representation were raised in the proceedings below and are reflected in the record.

This information is provided solely as procedural context. Appellant does not seek adjudication of any independent disability claim. Consistent with California Rules of Court, rule 1.100, this context is respectfully noted insofar as it relates to the Court's consideration of procedural fairness and access to the appellate process.

VI. RELEVANCE AND LIMITATION

This Notice is provided to inform the Court of:

- 1 The current procedural posture resulting from Respondent's default; and
- 2 The existence of parallel proceedings involving overlapping parties and issues.

Appellant does not seek to:

- 1 Augment the appellate record;
- 2 Introduce new evidence; or
- 3 Request any determination beyond the issues presented in the Opening Brief.

VII. CONCLUSION

Appellant respectfully submits this Notice to assist the Court as these consolidated appeals proceed toward submission and decision pursuant to California Rules of Court, rule 8.220(a)(2).
