STATEMENT OF CLAIM (PRO SE)

A. Parties

1. The Claimant, Brian Stuart-Young, is Chief Executive Officer of the Global Bank of Commerce, a licensed financial institution operating in Antigua and Barbuda. He is a longstanding investor in Antigua and Barbuda and serves as Ambassador-at-Large for the State.
2. The First Defendant is the United Progressive Party, including members of its Executive, a political organisation operating within Antigua and Barbuda.
3. The Second Defendant is Jack Stroll, a Canadian national who asserted claims and pursued litigation affecting the Global Bank of Commerce and the Claimant.

B. Related Proceedings

4. This claim is factually and jurisdictionally linked to Claim No. ANUHCV2025/0149 (Alkiviades David v. Defendants as Pleaded).
5. The Claimant does not seek to merge proceedings but relies on overlapping facts, actors, and conduct, while pleading distinct harm suffered personally.

C. Jurisdiction

6. This Honourable Court has jurisdiction because material acts occurred within Antigua and Barbuda; the Second Defendant travelled to Antigua and Barbuda in furtherance of the conduct complained of; members of the First Defendant's Executive participated in or facilitated aspects of that conduct; and the primary harm crystallised locally.
7. Jurisdiction is grounded on conduct-based and effects-based principles recognised at common law.

D. Factual Background

8. The Second Defendant asserted claims and pursued litigation impacting accounts and operations of the Global Bank of Commerce.
9. The Claimant avers that the asserted claims were materially inflated or mischaracterised and accompanied by coercive conduct, including threats of incarceration and reputational harm.
10. Members of the First Defendant are alleged to have been aware of or involved in communications and actions amplifying such pressure.

E. Unlawful Means Conspiracy

11. The Defendants combined and agreed to employ unlawful means to harm the Claimant, including instigating litigation for an improper collateral purpose and coordinating legal and political pressure.

F. Tortious Interference

12. The Defendants intentionally interfered with the Claimant's lawful professional duties and economic relations, causing foreseeable harm.

G. Governmental and Diplomatic Context

13. The Claimant was publicly associated with sovereign proceedings concerning the Alpha Nero matter.

14. The Claimant is an Ambassador-at-Large for Antigua and Barbuda and holder of a diplomatic passport, and the conduct complained of was reasonably capable of impairing diplomatic and state functions.

H. Damage

15. The Claimant has suffered reputational harm, professional and economic loss, emotional distress, and ongoing prejudice linked to parallel proceedings.

I. Witnesses and Evidence

16. The Claimant will rely on witness testimony including Alkiviades David and documentary evidence to be filed by affidavit.

J. Public Transparency Notice

17. The Claimant gives notice that filed pleadings may be published following filing solely for transparency and accuracy of the public record, not to influence the Court.

K. Relief Sought

18. The Claimant seeks damages, declaratory and injunctive relief, costs, and such further relief as the Court deems just.
