

APPELLANT'S SUPPLEMENTAL SUBMISSIONS (MASTER BUNDLE V2 – NO COMPRESSION)

I. INTRODUCTION

These submissions are filed by the Appellant as a disabled litigant in person.

They incorporate and preserve all prior filings, exhibits, and evidential records without removal or compression.

The matters before the Court span multiple jurisdictions and include:

- wrongful arrest in the United Kingdom;
- wrongful detention in the United States;
- evidential manipulation and procedural irregularities;
- commercial suppression of FilmOn TV and Hologram USA;
- sovereign asset recognition and interference;
- regulatory capture within the United Kingdom.

The Appellant is not mentally ill. The Appellant suffers from a documented neurological disability and has been subject to repeated attempts to mischaracterise that disability in proceedings.

II. WRONGFUL ARREST (UNITED KINGDOM)

The Appellant was arrested while serving legal papers and attempting to execute a lawful citizen's arrest.

Metropolitan Police CCTV and contemporaneous reporting confirm:

- interference with lawful process;
- disproportionate response;
- obstruction of litigation rights.

This event forms part of a broader pattern of interference.

III. WRONGFUL DETENTION (UNITED STATES)

The Appellant was detained beyond lawful sentence duration in Los Angeles.

During detention:

- ADA rights were violated;
- service animal Vader was removed;
- coercive medicalisation attempts were made;
- conditions impaired participation in legal proceedings.

This constitutes both constitutional and procedural harm.

IV. EVIDENCE INTEGRITY AND ROTHMAN WARNINGS

Prior to his death, attorney Barry Rothman warned the Appellant of a network involving legal and media actors.

Subsequent events include:

- disappearance and delayed recovery of evidential materials;
- corroborating declarations;
- procedural irregularities in filings.

These warnings are now materially supported by documentary evidence.

V. COMMERCIAL SUPPRESSION

The Appellant's businesses have suffered measurable harm:

- NBCUniversal licensing payments (~\$2M) confirm value of Hologram USA;
- Paramount Digital distribution agreement (~\$20M) was not honoured;
- Media Defender activity interfered with FilmOn TV distribution.

The combined effect is suppression of lawful commercial activity.

VI. REGULATORY CAPTURE (UNITED KINGDOM)

Investigative reporting and evidential materials demonstrate:

- overlap between regulatory bodies and litigants;
- failure to address misconduct despite notice;
- systemic delay and fragmentation.

This aligns with the "System – Record – Mechanism – Remedy" model.

VII. SOVEREIGN CONTEXT AND GOVERNMENT SUPPORT

The Prime Minister and Chief of Staff have supported anti-corruption efforts.

Documentation confirms:

- recognition of assets as sovereign/diplomatic;

- integration into economic development structures;
- alignment with national policy objectives.

Actions of the Attorney General are distinct and do not negate this support.

VIII. EVIDENCE MATRIX SUMMARY

A1–J4 exhibits collectively establish:

- wrongful arrest and detention;
- ADA violations;
- evidential irregularities;
- commercial suppression;
- sovereign recognition.

Full matrix cross-references are preserved in prior filings.

IX. RELIEF SOUGHT

The Appellant respectfully seeks:

- admission of all annexed evidence;
- stay of enforcement;
- further directions or adjournment;
- any relief the Court deems just.
