Your Lordship,

I respectfully provide this brief notice to assist the Court by updating it on a recent procedural development in related appellate proceedings in the United States which arise from overlapping factual circumstances, evidentiary materials, and procedural issues connected to the present claim.

On 16 March 2026, the California Court of Appeal, Second Appellate District, Division One, issued an order in the consolidated appeals B341119 and B345361 (Jane Doe v. Alkiviades A. David), arising from Los Angeles Superior Court Case No. 20STCV37498. The Respondent had moved to dismiss the appeal. The Court ordered that the Respondent's Request for Judicial Notice is granted and that determination of the motion to dismiss is deferred to the appellate panel. Accordingly, the appeal remains active and pending before the appellate panel.

In my opposition in the California appeal, I raised issues relating to procedural conduct affecting me as a disabled litigant in person, including disability accommodation issues and the handling of financial and asset disclosure matters connected with contempt-related proceedings. The appellate filings incorporate supporting evidentiary materials including approximately 27 pages of text message communications together with recent affidavits filed by Yelena Kalandar and Gary Shoefield which form part of the evidentiary record referenced in proceedings before this Court and the courts in England and Wales.

The California appellate record also references matters concerning the handling of my medical and disability status including the report prepared by Dr. Eric Wexler which I have addressed in the appellate filings in connection with the procedural issues under review.

I further note that related proceedings before the High Court of Justice in London, including Mahim Khan v. Alkiviades David (KB-2025-001991), remain subject to a temporary stay pending determination of matters before this Honourable Court. A procedural hearing is scheduled this week in London in which I have sought continuation of that stay pending this Court's determination and in light of the recent development in the California Court of Appeal.

This notice is provided to assist the Court in understanding the current cross-jurisdictional procedural posture of related proceedings and in the spirit of full transparency and international judicial comity.

Should the Court require copies of the California Court of Appeal order or related filings, I would be pleased to provide them promptly.
