

REPORT: Alleged Suppression of Court Filings and Jurisdictional Manipulation

This report documents evidence of a material alteration to the jurisdictional framing of Claim No. ANUHCV2025/0149 before the Eastern Caribbean Supreme Court (Antigua & Barbuda), raising concerns of suppression of filings and interference with the administration of justice.

Key Findings

1. The original Claim Form filed on 17 April 2025 explicitly names the Executive Members of the United Progressive Party (UPP) as defendants.
2. Subsequent jurisdictional listings and the Settled Draft Order dated 16 January 2026 omit the UPP without any recorded judicial order striking or severing that party.
3. The omission had the effect of removing a live abuse-of-process and parallel-exposure argument relevant to jurisdiction and comity.

Embedded Evidence

- Filed Claim Form (17 April 2025) – showing UPP as Defendant No. 13.
- Settled Draft Order (16 January 2026) – omitting UPP.
- Court transcript excerpts evidencing jurisdictional confusion and incomplete record.

The unexplained removal of a properly filed party from the jurisdictional record, absent judicial determination, meets the legal definition of suppression of material information and warrants independent regulatory and judicial scrutiny.
