## **COVER LETTER TO AUTHORITIES**

To: Chief of Police Everton Jeffers, CID Antigua & Barbuda This dossier is submitted as a formal escalation requiring immediate review. The matters contained herein now intersect active proceedings in the United States, United Kingdom, and Antigua & Barbuda. Given the cross-border nature and evidentiary framework, consideration for INTERPOL coordination is formally requested. Failure to assess or act upon this material may establish institutional knowledge and potential secondary liability.

## **SUBJECTS OF INVESTIGATION (NON-EXHAUSTIVE)**

The following individuals and entities are identified as subjects requiring investigation, based on affidavits, communications, and litigation records: - Legal actors connected to multiple proceedings - Media platform operators linked to prior litigation - Individuals identified in sworn testimony All identifications are presented as matters for investigation, not determinations of fact.

## **EVIDENCE LINKAGE**

Key materials include: • Affidavits (Shoefield, Calendar) • Electronic communications (Rizzo messages) • Medical/psychiatric reports (Wexler documentation) • Court filings across jurisdictions These materials collectively establish patterns requiring investigation.

## **CRITICAL TIMELINE**

March 2026: CID complaint filed April 1, 2026: Procedural default milestone (California) Ongoing: UK appeal and enforcement posture These events create a synchronized legal timeline requiring coordinated response.

## **INTERPOL REFERRAL BASIS**

The allegations involve potential economic crime, coercion, and cross-border obstruction. Accordingly, referral for international coordination is requested.
