This consolidated document presents synchronized legal actions across three jurisdictions. It establishes reasonable grounds for criminal investigation, informs appellate courts of material developments, and preserves procedural integrity across Antigua, the United Kingdom, and the United States.

SECTION 1 – ANTIGUA CID CRIMINAL COMPLAINT

Executive Statement

There are reasonable grounds to suspect evidence tampering, obstruction of justice, and interference with judicial process in Claim ANUHCV2025/0149. This complaint is supported by documentary evidence across multiple jurisdictions.

Primary Allegation

Following the 16 January 2026 hearing, there are reasonable grounds to suspect that court documents and defendant records were altered, substituted, or improperly handled, affecting recognized defaults and judicial integrity.

Harm

The Complainant has suffered financial loss, reputational damage, and interference with legal rights. The integrity of the judicial process is also impacted.

Requests

1. Immediate criminal investigation.
2. Preservation of court and AG Chambers records.
3. Review of registry integrity.
4. Coordination with international authorities.

SECTION 2 – UNITED KINGDOM COURT OF APPEAL NOTICE

Purpose

To notify the Court of material criminal developments in Antigua directly affecting evidential integrity and enforcement fairness.

Legal Basis

Ladd v Marshall [1954] 1 WLR 1489 (fresh evidence); CPR 83.7 (stay – special circumstances); CPR 52.21.

Relief Sought

Recognition of criminal investigation, preservation of current position, and consideration of adjournment or stay.

SECTION 3 – CALIFORNIA COURT OF APPEAL NOTICE

Status

Respondent default has occurred pursuant to California Rules of Court Rule 8.220, permitting determination based on Appellant's submissions.

Parallel Proceedings

A criminal complaint has been filed in Antigua concerning evidence tampering and obstruction of justice.

Request

The Court is respectfully requested to proceed in light of default and consider the broader evidentiary context.
