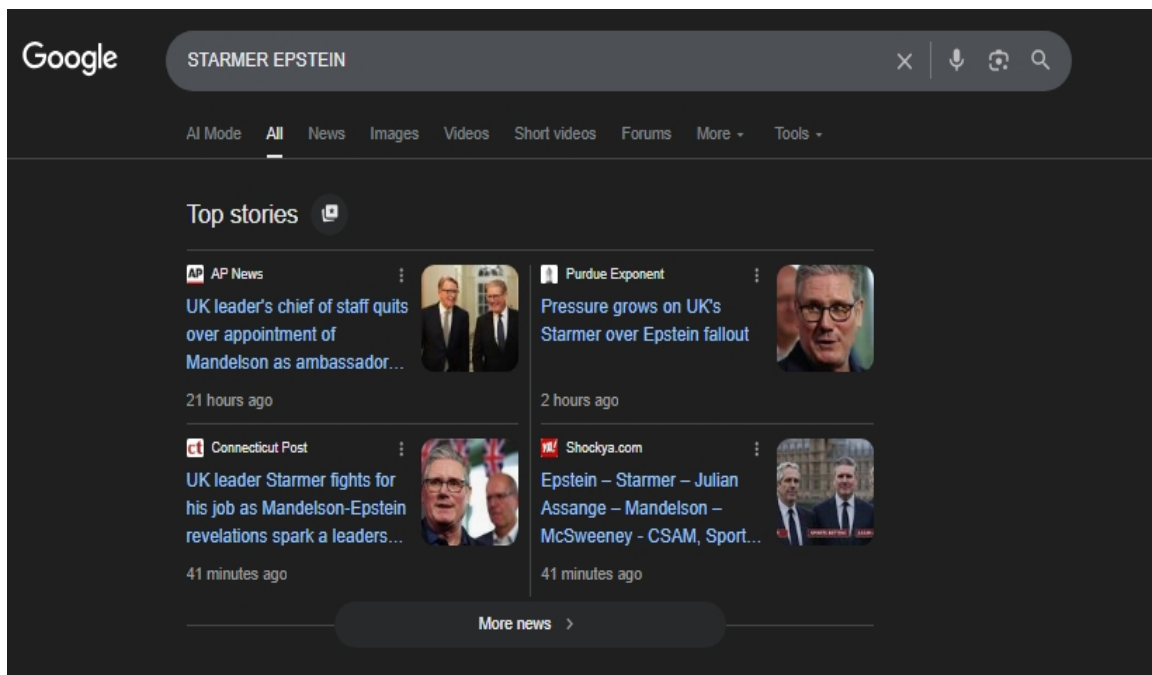


SUPPLEMENTAL RECORD – NOTICE, PERSISTENCE, AND NETWORK IMPACT

This Supplemental Record is filed to demonstrate contemporaneous notice, persistence after notice, and the measurable systemic impact of distributed publication across independent media nodes (the “SIN Network”). It is tendered to support the necessity of coercive compliance measures where Respondents continue to refuse appearance notwithstanding notice.

Exhibit A – Search Visibility and Contemporaneous Public Notice

Attached is a contemporaneous screenshot dated 9 February 2026 showing aggregated news results for the query “Starmer Epstein.” The display reflects simultaneous indexing of legacy wire services (AP News), regional outlets, and independent publishers including ShockYA. This demonstrates that the subject matter of these proceedings entered the shared public and professional information environment, rebutting any claim of inadvertence or lack of awareness.



Combined SIN Network Impact

The SIN Network operates as a federated, distributed publication architecture integrating court-record filings, investigative reporting, live media, and independent syndication. When combined with legacy media amplification, this structure produces measurable effects: (i) rapid cross-jurisdictional notice; (ii) persistence of indexed records resistant to single-platform suppression; (iii) professional uptake by regulators, insurers, banks, and counsel monitoring reputational and compliance risk; and (iv) exhaustion of lesser, non-coercive notice mechanisms. The convergence of independent and legacy media indexing establishes foreseeability, persistence after notice, and the futility of further informal measures, thereby supporting escalation to coercive compliance orders.
