

SWISSX – CRIMINAL COMPLAINT (WEAPONIZED VERSION)

FORMAL SUBMISSION TO CID – ANTIGUA & BARBUDA

LEGAL BASIS & JURISDICTION

This complaint is grounded in established legal principles including obstruction of justice, evidence tampering, and conspiracy. It engages cross-border cooperation frameworks and invokes duties under common law and statutory criminal provisions applicable in Antigua & Barbuda.

PRIMARY ALLEGATION

There are reasonable grounds to suspect deliberate interference with judicial process in Claim ANUHCV2025/0149, including alteration or substitution of court records affecting multiple defendants.
