I. INTRODUCTION

VI(F) TEXT MESSAGES (MK)

Messages referencing 'MK' raise arguable identity and coordination issues requiring scrutiny.

VIII. SYSTEMIC INTERFERENCE, EVIDENTIAL RISK, AND CONSEQUENCES

These matters form a coherent pattern affecting process integrity, participation, and evidence continuity. The Court must consider whether enforcement can safely proceed without resolving these issues. Proceeding risks endorsing a compromised process and undermining justice. The Court is invited to pause enforcement and review the evidential material.
